Usefulness and Richness

MERLOT has institutional partners working together to support and maintain MERLOT's Discipline Communities. The discipline communities include, but are not limited to, languages. They are focused primarily around academic disciplines (Biology, Business, Chemistry, Engineering, Health Science, History, Information Technology, Mathematics, Music, Physics, Psychology, Statistics, Teacher Education and of course World Languages). In addition, there is a community for faculty development and one for academic technology staff. The collection can be sorted by title, author, rating, date entered or item type, with the default sort order being by five star rated materials first. Many of languages represented by materials submissions and online resources. Some of them are Arabic, Chinese, French, German, Greek, Italian, Japanese, Latin, Portuguese, Russian and Spanish.
