Mini articles may consist of a single, but well-described piece of information, such as:

- data and/or a plot plus a description,
- description of a new method or instrumentation,
- negative results,
- concept or design study.

Microarticles are very short papers (no longer than 2 pages) containing useful data, descriptions or other information that are too limited to carry a full research article.

To be publishable in this journal, papers must meet the scientific quality standards, contain significant and original new science. Mini articles should be self-contained, provide the scientific context of the described work and consist of the following elements: a title, list of authors (plus affiliations), abstract, keywords, a main text and at least 4 references.

Towards ensuring high editorial standards, every article submission is preliminarily assessed by the editors of the journal before being sent to independent referees.
