In this issue there are five scientific papers. Manzak Saka et al. reviewed the psychiatric perspective to oral dysesthesia regarding pathogenesis, associated conditions and the treatment options. In a research letter, Cevik et al. reported their preliminary results about disturbed postprandial lipid metabolism in patients with psoriasis, and they suggested that these results might be associated with the increased risk of cardiovascular disease in psoriasis.
