

AUTHOR GUIDELINES

Publishing Principles

International Journal of Education in Architecture and Design (IJEAD) is an electronic, international, double-blind peer-reviewed, open-access, scientific journal. The journal is published twice a year in March and September. Manuscripts in English are accepted. All the articles accepted in the journal are published open-access. No fee is charged and authors are not paid for any of the stages of article submission, evaluation and publication. The journal's aim is to publish articles written on curriculum models, course syllabus models, formal and informal studies/works, experimental works, assessments / reviews on quality of education on the areas of architectural education, design education, urban planning education, interior architecture education, industrial design education, landscape design education and other related disciplines. The journal includes research articles, discussion articles, and review articles on the above-mentioned topics. These sections are double-blind peer-reviewed.

Writing Rules

The type of the text (research article, discussion article and review articles) will be proposed by the author; it will be negotiated with the author and decided by the editorial board. The first page of the manuscript should include the title of the manuscript, the names, surnames, titles, affiliation, ORCID numbers, and email addresses of the authors. In addition, only the corresponding author's mailing address and a contact number should be noted. If the submitted manuscript is produced from an article presented at a scientific meeting, it has to be indicated together with the name of the meeting, the date, title of the work and the city where it was organized. Likewise, if the article is produced from a master's thesis or PhD dissertation, it has to be indicated with the name of the author, title of the thesis, the year of the thesis, the university, and the supervisor's name. In addition to the information mentioned above, on the first-page, abstract and 5 keywords should be given and the following pages should contain full text. The abstract should preferably be 200 words. The last page of the manuscript should include the statement of "Acknowledgments" indicating any individual and / or institutional sponsorship and / or support, and whether the submitted manuscript is produced from an article presented at a scientific meeting (it has to be indicated together with the name of the meeting, the date, title of the work and the city where it was organized). Likewise, if the article is produced from a master's thesis or PhD dissertation, it has to be indicated with the name of the author, title of the thesis, the year of the thesis, the university, and the supervisor's name. Additionally, it should include the statement of "Declaration of Competing Interest". Authors also should add their short biographies not longer than 200 words. "Copyright Transfer Form" should be completed and sent together with the manuscript. Images should be both placed into the manuscript and saved separately. See "Author Guidelines" and "Submission Checklist".

The Main Manuscript

Preferred writing length for articles is maximum 8000 words including footnotes and bibliography. Manuscripts should be prepared in "Times New Roman" font with 12 font size and 1.5 line spacing. 2.5 cm margins should be left on each side of the pages and all pages should be numbered. The subtitles in the text should be bold. They should be numbered and the first letters of each of the word should be a capital letter.

Figures and Tables

Photographs, pictures, diagrams and graphics in the text should be named "Figures" and should be numbered. The first letter of the "figure text" should be a capital letter. It should continue as lower case. Tables and charts should be named as "Table" and should be numbered (Example: Table 1. Inside the text reference sources). Figure captions should be placed under the figure and table captions should be at the top of the table. The figures in the text should be prepared in JPEG format, 300 dpi resolution and the short edge of the image should not be less than 15 cm.

The tables in the text should be prepared and saved in the separate WORD files; they should not be sent as “pictures”. The figures and tables should be uploaded to the system as separate files as they are in the text.

Referencing

Abbreviated references in the text “in-text source” should be given in parentheses together with the surnames of the authors and the year of the study. As far as possible, master’s theses and online sites should not be used as references.

Author(s) should use Harvard style for references. The author(s) may benefit from the Harvard style in the link provided for references

CITATION IN TEXT

FORMAT	-The author’s surname and year of publication are cited in the text. - If there is a quotation from another source, the page number should be included. - If more than three authors are cited, give the name of the first author then “et al.” in your essay text. You should list all of the authors in your bibliography.
Paraphrasing	Gardner’s theory (1983) state that several intelligence types exist.
Quotations	Gardner claims that “the death may involve anywhere from 15 percent to 85 percent of the initial neuronal population” (Gardner, 1983: 46).

SECONDARY CITATION

FORMAT	If you want to cite a source within a source, you should try to trace the original reference. If this is not possible, you should acknowledge both sources in the text, but only include the item you actually read in your reference list.
In Text	Markova (1979, cited in Gardner, 2011: 408) refers to... * Note that, Gardner, not Markova, will go in the references list because you have not read Markova’s original work: You read about it in Gardner’s book.
