Editorial Principals

Folklor/Literature is published quarterly. Winter/January, Spring/April, Summer/July and Autumn/October. The main goal is to publish original researches on folklore, anthropology, education, history, language and literature and create a discussion platform on these subjects. Folklor/Literature is an academical journal which publishes original articles on folklore, anthropology, education, history, language and literature.

The overall responsibility and writing preferences for the published articles belong to the author of the article. The royalty rights of the accepted articles are considered transferred to Folklor/Literature. In order for any article to be published in Folklor/Literature, it should not have been previously published or accepted to be published elsewhere.

Referees' Evaluation of Papers

Articles forwarded to Folklor/Literature are first reviewed by the Editorial Board in terms of journal's publishing principles. Those which are found unsuitable are returned to their authors to be corrected. Academic objectivity and scientific quality are considered of paramount importance. Those considered acceptable are initially referred to two referees who are well-known for their works in relevant fields. Names of the referees are kept confidential and referee reports are safe-kept for two years. For publication of articles, two positive reports are required. In case one referee report is negative while the other is favorable, the article may be forwarded to a third referee for further evaluation or alternatively the board, based on the contents of the reports may feel confident to make a final decision. The authors are to consider the criticism, suggestions and corrections offered by the referees and by the editorial board. If they disagree, they are entitled to counter present their views and justifications. Final decision rests with the editorial board. Articles which are not accepted for publication are not returned to their authors.

The Language

The language of the journal is Turkish. Articles in other languages may be published, not to exceed one third of an issue.

Writing and Edition Rules

1. Papers should be typed in MS Word program.
2. Papers should be prepared in accordance with the principles set forth are to be sent in three copies and one CD to Folklore/Literature at the correspondence address.
3. The maximum length for the papers is 20 pages.

The first page should be written as follows:

1. Names and surnames are written in upper left hand corner (left aligned)
2. The Title (left aligned)
3. Translator name for translated papers (right aligned)
4. For original papers in Turkish, the paper should include an abstract in English, French or Germany, briefly and laconically expressing the subject in maximum 100 words. The translation of paper's title should be given under the title of abstract. After that, the abstract should be taken place. A detailed Turkish abstract should be given for the papers in the other languages. The papers which do not have an abstract will not be published.
5. Leaving one line empty after the body of abstract, there should be key words, minimum 3 and maximum 5 words.
6. Explanation about the author (with *)
7. If there is, explanation about the paper (with **), for translation explanation about the source text (with **)
8. If there is, explanation about the translator (with ***)

Footnotes and Bibliography

The footnotes and bibliography should be given according to APA5 (American Psychological Association) standards. The original source should be indicated in the secondary quotations.
