First, in this issue, *Kur'an-ı Kerîm Işığında Bir Öğretici Olarak Hz. Peygamber'in Bazı Nitelikleri [Some Qualities of the Prophet as a Teacher in the Light of the Holy Qur'an]* by Dr. Ahmed ALABALIK aims to discuss the



essential considerations an educator must heed, as guided by the Quran, in the formation of a new generation. It identifies the foundational principles employed by Prophet Muhammad in his educational approach, aligning with his assertion, "I have been sent as a teacher." The author emphasizes that an educator, as per the Quran and Sunnah, should have the qualities such as 'Tolerance and sincerity', 'Courtesy and compassion', 'Ability to win hearts and inspire', 'Tailoring communication to the audience's level of comprehension', 'Deriving lessons from surrounding events' and 'Simplicity and ease in communication'. This paper provides really affective samples drawn from the experience and principles of the Prophet for the contemporary world.

In another research paper, Esin ÖZTÜRK, MA student in Dicle University, Türkiye, focuses on rituals regarding grave visits, and highlights sociological and anthropological insights within her phenomenological research entitled *Mezar Ziyareti Geleneği Bağlamında Toplumda Yerleşen İnanç ve Ritüeller: Diyarbakır Hazreti Süleyman Camii Örneği [Beliefs and Rituals Established in Society within the Context of Grave Visiting Tradition: The Case of Hazreti Suleiman Mosque in Diyarbakir]*. It is meaningful to believe in the sanctity of the people in the graves, that is *the companions of the Prophet*, and to visit them to pray with the feeling of being much closer to God in their presence. Additionally, asking God to remove the obstacles on the visitors' destiny through prayer appears the be one of the indicators to strengthen the support prays, juxtaposing those 27 companions' existences between the lines.

And next, Muzaffer YELDAĞ, in his paper entitled "Fitness Merkezlerinde Vücut Geliştirme Sporu Yapan Sporcuların Antrenman Alışkanlıkları ve TENS Cihazı Kullanımı [Training Habits of Bodybuilding Athletes in Fitness Centers and Use of TENS Device]" endeavors to examine the training status of athletes who do bodybuilding sports in fitness centers in the Turkish Republic of Northern Cyprus (TRNC) and the effect of TENS [Transcutaneous Electrical Nerve Stimulation] device on their training process. Data from 15 male athletes show that TENS application contributes positively to the effectiveness of fitness training. As a result, this study emphasizes that the addition of TENS application to the fitness training of athletes interested in fitness sports, accompanied by conscious experts, can contribute positively to their development.

Finally, Ali KORKUT and Necdet KONAN, in their scale development study, proposes an instrument to gather reliable and functional data regarding strategical leadership in schools. The authors provides statistical proofs about the reliability and validity.

We hope that the issues of our journal shall contribute to the field of interdisciplinary research literature. We would like to thank our journal



editors, authors, reviewers and all the others who have contributed to the preparation process of this issue.
