She is also the editor-in-chief of the review, *Echo-Interdisciplinary Journal of Communication, Languages, Cultures, Societies*.

VINCENZA IADEVAIA

Vincenza Iadevaia holds a PhD in Comparative Studies from Florida Atlantic University. In 2020, in collaboration with the Department of Linguistics at Boğaziçi University, Turkey, Iadevaia produced a documentary based on interviews and life testimonies of elderly deaf people (*We were there ... we are here*) as part of the *Sign-Hub Project* which was funded by the European Commission (Horizon, 2020). Her research interests focus on Italian diaspora studies. She is also interested in documentary and ethnography. Currently, she is developing two documentary projects (on the Italian community in South Florida and on Nomad Women in South Turkey). Iadevaia has worked for several Italian film productions. Her experience in the film industry complements her academic strengths, letting her integrate the practical and theoretical aspects of films. She teaches Italian as a foreign language and Italian Cinema (previously at the University of Connecticut and at FAU, currently at Boğaziçi University).

GIANNINA A. LUCANTONI

Giannina A. Lucantoni completed her doctoral research at SUNY, Buffalo in 2022. Her areas of expertise include Italian American author Pietro di Donato, and twentieth-century Italian American literature. In addition to teaching adjunct at the university level and conducting research as an independent scholar, Dr. Lucantoni teaches high school English.

STEFANO LUCONI

Stefano Luconi teaches US History at the University of Padua in Italy. He specializes in Italian migrations to the United States with specific attention to Italian Americans' political experience and transformations of their ethnic identity. On

these topics, he wrote From Paesani to White Ethnics: The Italian Experience in Philadelphia (SUNY P, 2001) and The Italian-American Vote in Providence, Rhode Island, 1916-1948 (Fairleigh Dickinson UP, 2004). His most recent book is L'anima nera degli Stati Uniti: Gli afro-americani e il difficile cammino verso l'eguaglianza, 1619-2023 (Cleup, 2023).

ELISABETTA MARINO

Elisabetta Marino is Associate Professor of English literature at the University of Rome Tor Vergata and head of "Asia and the West" research center. She is the author of four monographs: a volume on the figure of Tamerlane in British and American literature (2000); an introduction to British Bangladeshi literature (2005); a study on the relationship between Mary Shelley and Italy (2011); an analysis of the Romantic dramas on mythological subjects (2016). In 2006, she published the first Italian translation of poems by Maria Mazziotti Gillan. Between 2001 and 2023 she has edited/co-edited fifteen collections of essays (three more are forthcoming) and a Special Forum of *Journal of Transnational American Studies* (2012). In 2022, she translated *Parkwater*, a Victorian novel by Ellen Wood, for the first time into Italian. She co-edited a special issue of *De-Genere: Journal of Postcolonial, Literary and Gender Studies* (2022).

GIULIA TARANTINO

Giulia Tarantino grew up in Soverato, in the South of Italy, and spent several years studying in Rome. In 2018, she decided to move to Orlando, Florida, where she spent one year working. This experience, in conjunction with the study of Anglo-American literature, aroused a passionate interest in the Italian American condition on which she decided to focus her research project. Upon graduating from the University of Rome Tor Vergata, fascinated by the academic world, she felt the urge to further explore the literary field. Having realized the importance of the teachers' role in her life path, she decided to pursue a career as a professor. In 2021, she obtained the tenure for one year as teacher of English Language and Literature at the institute "Maria Ausiliatrice" in Soverato.
